



Education Learning and Working Together -Your Rights-

COVID-19 and lockdown restrictions have had a huge impact on schools and how children are taught. This means that how you speak to your child's school or teacher, and how you receive messages may have changed a lot too.

Despite the challenges of **COVID-19**, you still have the following rights:

- You can have a voice in your child's education and you should be included in decisions that directly affect your child's learning and wellbeing.
- The school should work with you to understand what is happening with your child's education. You can speak to your child's teacher if you have concerns or questions.
- The school should communicate with you in plain English and provide you with information in an accessible format.
- You should have access to information, services and resources that support you as a parent or family.
- You can request an interpreter/translator if you need one. The school can call you with a telephone interpreter. This will make social distancing easier.
