Preparing for a home visit



Once you have agreed to the Vision Support Service being involved with your child, a Vision Support Teacher will phone to arrange a visit to your home to meet you and your child at a time that is convenient for you.

She will give you her mobile phone number so that, if you need to postpone the visit, you can contact her and arrange another time.

Here are some things you can do to help the visit go well:

- It's best if the room where you meet is as quiet as possible, without any distractions so
 - switch off the radio or TV
 - don't allow any pets in the room
- We would appreciate you not smoking during the visit

During the visit the Vision Support Teacher will have time to chat to you about your child and talk through what has been happening since your child was diagnosed with a visual loss.
